COURSES FOR COLLEGE CREDIT

The Center for Distance Education offers a variety of courses for academic credit. Delivery methods, including Interactive Video, Off-campus, and Online are designed to make university credit easily accessible for students who work full-time or live a distance from the university. Courses carry graduate or undergraduate credit. Students must be admitted to the university and follow established registration procedures. The Center for Distance Education (CDE) coordinates the delivery of Interactive Video, Off-campus and Online courses. CDE also houses dual credit programs for high school students including interactive delivery (LINC: Lamar's Interactive Network Connection) and Lamar Early Access Program (LEAP). Distance education offers the opportunity for students to take courses with flexible time requirements and at locations convenient to them. DISTANCE LEARNING FEE INFORMATION

For students enrolled in Distance Education classes ONLY, the following university fees will be waived: Health Center Fee-\$30, Property Deposit Fee-\$10, Recreation Center Fee-\$50 and the Setzer Center Fee-\$30. All Distance Learning methods are assessed a \$25 per credit hour Distance Learning Fee. All Distance Learning Fees are NON-REFUNDABLE after 12th class day for Fall and Spring semesters, 4th class day for summer sessions and 1st class day for mini sessions.

ONLINE COURSES

Online (web-based) courses can be completed from home, office or on campus. Before taking any online course, you should have a basic working knowledge of how to use a web browser and how to follow directions for setting the options in your browser to work with Blackboard. You should also be able to download and install plug-ins as required. You may not be contacted directly by your professor before you begin the class so it is imperative that you read the entire LUOnline (Blackboard) page to learn how to sign-on to your online course, enter your Blackboard ID and password, and check the "Preparing Your Computer" link to make sure you and your computer are ready.
