

The Lamar University Criminal Justice program is pleased to announce the availability of five \$6000 graduate assistantships for the Fall 2009-Spring 2010 academic year.

To be eligible, students must be admitted into the graduate program in Master of Science in Applied Criminology, have completed all required background courses, and attend on a full-time basis (9 credit hours per semester). Assistantship recipients will be required to work alongside a faculty member for the fall and spring semesters (20 hours a week).

To apply, complete the Lamar University graduate school application available in Wimberly 118 or online at http://www.lamar.edu/admissions/1366_6634.htm and follow the instructions provided. Strong GRE scores and undergraduate GPAs are expected.

In addition, students interested in a graduate assistantship should send directly to the criminal justice program graduate director (1) two letters of recommendation and (2) a letter of interest/application describing one's background, qualifications, and career goals and ambitions.
